## 21-Year-Old Man Faces 4 Counts of Attempted Murder 1st Degree and Multiple Assault Charges, Including Illegal Gun Possession

On October 12, 2022, Deputy Marshals from the Superior Court attempted to serve a bench warrant around 4:07p.m., at Estate Solberg, the residence of Dorian Hariston.

While attempting to serve the warrant Hariston opened fire on the Deputies and barricaded himself in his residence. Hariston was taken into custody without incident after a short standoff with Local and Federal law enforcement officers after he attempted to flee his residence.

On October 21, 2022, Mr. Hariston, who was already in the custody of the Bureau of Corrections was arrested and charged, with Attempted Murder 1st Degree (4 Counts),

the above listed charges are for what occurred on October 12, 2022, when the Marshal's attempted to serve the bench warrant. Dorian Hariston 21-years-old, bail was set at \$500,000.

He was remanded back to the Bureau of corrections.
